2:00	Opening Prayer
3:00	Walking it Out – means to believe who God says you are
3:20	John 8:26 - They replied we want to perform God’s works too. What should we do? Jesus replied, “This is the only work God has for you: believe in the one he has sent.”
4:16	Believing in the finished work of Jesus Christ is enough. This is the “To Do” list of our faith.
4:40	It is the greatest battle of our faith and the focus of all spiritual warfare.
4:50	Will we believe what God says we are and renew our minds to that truth?
6:53	Jesus said I’m going to boil it down to one thing I want you to do: believe who you are God says you are.
7:00	Identity will always be the crux of the battle (seen beginning in Adam and Eve)
8:30	The original temptation was about something internal more than external.
9:00	The root of the original lie of Satan was to believe that You (Adam/ Eve) were not enough and that you were lacking something and that there is something that you must do in order to be complete. This is still true for us.
10:00	Believing who God says we are will produce a massive change in our world.
10:50	Doing is always the result of what you believe.
11:15	Quote from the book “Wired for Success, Programmed for Failure”: <i>“Success for so many is a goal rather than a state. A state of being. That which is seen as a goal to work for and can only be earned by continued labor that sustains the current definition. That which is a state, however, is about ‘being’. When success is about being it always leads to healthy doing. Doing is never-ending. Being works from the inside out because it’s who you are. Doing is an attempt to work from the outside in. Doing is always forced and unhealthy. Being is your default and it happens effortlessly because it’s about who you are and not about what you do.”</i>
12:18	Those talked about in John chapter 6 were not interested in being; they were interested in doing. They were not interested in having the reality of the identity of Jesus in their heart they were looking for something external to complete them when in reality the completing work of Jesus is done inside the corridors of our heart.
13:45	Galatians 5:6 For in Christ Jesus neither circumcision or un-circumcision avails anything but faith working through love.
14:10	We need to have the same world view that God has. And God’s world view is, “man I love those people.”
14:50	What does love look like in our world? 1 – it starts in our heart 2 – it’s formed in our home 3 – it shows up at church: how we treat each other and we can be better with 4 – it’ following us around: the ministry of “showing up”
17:15	Ephesians 5:2 - (NLT) Live a life filled with love following the example of Christ. He loved us and offered himself as a sacrifice for us, a pleasing aroma to God. (NKJ) Walk in Love
18:15	Love is an action of our faith not merely an emotion.
18:20	Agape – God’s world view on love
19:27	No longer “us and them” mentality. We have to start seeing people as God sees people and they are worthy of heaven’s finest

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20:00	1 Cor. 13:4-8 Love suffers long (patient) and is kind (show one's self as mild)	
21:16	Love does not envy (not to be heated or to boil over with hatred) Evil is the negative form of the word "zeal".	
22:22	Love does not parade itself	
22:40	What do you see in the world around you? Worthless sinners or precious, valued, loved and respected people.	
24:00	Love doesn't seek its own Phil. 2:3 – in humility consider others better than yourself.	
25:00	People are looking for other people who will believe in them. To say, "Gods' for you and I'm for you!"	
25:15	Love is not easily provoked or irritated	
25:50	Love thinks no evil	
26:20	Doesn't rejoice in unrighteousness but rejoices in the truth	
26:26	Love bears (protects) all things, believes (thinks the best instead of the worst) all things, hopes all things endures all things	
28:00	Friendships that endure: The manifestation of our destiny happens when there's a conflict.	
29:15	Love never fails – Fail means to fall out of, to fall down, fall off, fall from. We've cheapened the reality of what it means when God says, "I Love those people! And I won't fall out of love with those people."	
30:25	We are to "be" Jesus to this world.	
31:20	1 John 2:2 – and he is the propitiation (mercy seat) for our sins but not only for our sins but also for the sins of the whole world.
